RE: AB 548 (Levine) Multifamily Dwelling Recycling

Dear Governor Schwarzenegger:

I write to respectfully urge your signature on Assembly Bill 548, which will increase California's recycling rate by expanding recycling opportunities at multifamily dwellings. Specifically, AB 548 will require that an owner of a multifamily dwelling provide appropriate recycling services for the dwelling in accordance with the local jurisdiction's recycling plan.

While California is diverting more than 50 percent of generated waste, it is estimated that just 15% of waste generated at multi-family dwelling is currently diverted. Whereas just 19.1% of Californians live in multi-family dwellings, these housing units account for 26 percent of the residential waste stream. AB 548 is aimed increasing recycling in California by closing the curbside recycling gap for multifamily dwellings.

A 2004 waste stream analysis by the California Integrated Waste Management Board found that 26.4% percent of the multi-family waste stream is recyclable and that more than 894,687 tons of recyclable materials are currently being landfilled by multi-dwelling residents.

While nearly 70 percent of Californians living in single family homes have access to curbside recycling, no more than 40 percent of those living in multi-family dwellings have access to a residential recycling opportunity—and many of those are unaware of it.

Expanding curbside recycling to multifamily dwellings could divert an additional 329,000 tons of recyclable materials. Additionally this increased recycling will help in reducing greenhouse gas emissions by nearly one million tons.


